

Authorization and Copyright

The American Burn Association Annual Meetings and other educational programs represent the best in professional multidisciplinary burn care education. As such, the ABA desires to extend the life of these educational programs after the live events through print, audio and/or video recordings that may be made available to members or to others with or without a charge.

Under federal copyright law, the authors of creative works including but not limited to speeches, presentations, video and audio recordings, articles, books, and other publications, own the copyright to the work unless they assign the rights or license to someone else or unless the work is categorized as a work-made-for-hire. For the purpose of this administrative regulation(AR), the creative work is defined as the oral presentation, handout(s), PowerPoint® slides and audio and/or video recordings (collectively the “Materials”). The ABA asks presenters at conferences, seminars, or similar functions (“Meetings”) arranged and administered by the ABA, including any of its committees to give the ABA license to use and repurpose the materials for additional ABA educational activities and programs. **Presenters are not required to give this license in order to participate as a speaker at any ABA – sponsored meeting, and the ABA will not repurpose any of the Materials without the presenter’s express permission.**

It is the responsibility of the presenter who gives the ABA the right to repurpose their Materials to ensure that such Materials are HIPPA compliant and free of copyright issues. To be HIPPA compliant, the presenter must obtain permission from patients for any Materials that include the patient’s likeness or other identifying information in the presentation. To be free of copyright issues, the presenter must either have clear copyright ownership of all figures, tables, photographs, video or audio recordings, or other Materials used in their presentation, or have written permission from the author or authors of such Materials. The presenter also should include acknowledgements of source for all figures, tables or photographs taken from publications. The ABA recognizes that this is far easier to do for handouts than PowerPoint presentations and hopes that, at the very least, presenters will consider contributing such a handout for each presentation. Furthermore, if you are presenting original unpublished data in your presentation, verify the “prior publication” policies of your potential target publisher prior to presentation of the data.

Authorization and Copyright License to Use Materials Beyond the Time of Presentation at the Annual Meeting

I understand and acknowledge that I will receive no royalty or other monetary compensation from the ABA for license granted hereunder and the subsequent use of the Materials by the ABA.
